The Construction Industries Commission held a regular meeting on November 14, 2012. Officially attending the meeting was:

1. Convene, Determination of Quorum and Introductions: Commissioners and Audiences Chairman Baker established that a quorum of the Commissioners was present convened the meeting at 9:35 a.m.

2. Approve Agenda

MOTION: Commissioner Dekker moved for the Approval of Agenda. Commissioner Kaufman seconded the motion. VOTE: All voted in favor of the motion.

3. Public Comment

4. Directors Report – Director Martinez reported on the following items:

- Martha Murillo has been hire as a Compliance Officer
- Melody Goslow was hired for the Office and Permitting Manager in Las Cruces
- Joel Joyce was hired as a General Building Inspector, Albuquerque area
- Curtis Derrick Fortney was hired as a General Building Inspector, Gallup area
- Aaron Moore was hired as an Electrical Inspector, Hobbs area
- Chief Inspectors Kelly Hunt and Ray Benavidez have provided excellent leadership over the past few months for the efforts in covering the Hobbs area

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- Congratulations to Deputy Director Land Clark who has accepted the Chief Building Official position for the city of Albuquerque's Planning and Zoning Department. Land's years of institutional knowledge and ability to distill information so the Division runs efficiently in all aspects will be missed. He will be a huge asset to the city and the industry.
- On October 11, 2012, Director Martinez presented at the ASA Membership meeting. Great opportunity to connect with the Subcontracting community on all of CID's efforts to streamline licensing and present the Electronic Plan Review (EPR) program
- On November 7, 2012, Deputy Director Clark presented the Las Cruces Homebuilders Association with the new EPR program. CID Bureau Chiefs presented key changes to code with the adoption of the 2009 IECC. The code piece was beneficial to the Association as the city of Las Cruces has adopted the NM Codes. The Alamogordo Homebuilders have now requested the same presentation.
- In October, 2012, Director Martinez met with Senator Leavell to discuss concerns regarding licensing and delays for oil patch work in the Hobbs area. With the volume of well installations and the need to approve electrical connections quickly to not impede production, the oil and gas companies cannot wait for individual approvals. CID has clarified the licensing requirements for "behind the fence work" and will hold an additional stakeholder meeting with Senator Leavell to streamline the permitting process.
- Superintendent Dennis and Director Martinez visited the Union Pacific site last month and toured the entire 12 mile facility. When completed, it will serve as the largest refueling station in the country.
- CID Bureau Chief J.T. Baca hosted a workshop on the October 29, 2012 for a (2) day code update and outreach training. This was provided on behalf of Dona Ana County for their area journeyman, code officials and contractors to accommodate their adoption of the current CID codes. CEU credits were provided each day for the code update presentation to allow journeyman the opportunity at meeting the CID requirements.
- CID staff met with the City of Las Cruces Mayor and City Manager on September 25, 2012 to discuss the city's adoption of the NM codes and in October, 2012 the city Council unanimously passed the sate code adoption.
- Director Martinez, Licensing Manager Andy Dalmy and PSI staff visited the Dona Ana Community College and toured the facility where they are offering a location to PSI to conduct practical testing for CID. This will serve as a huge benefit to contractors in the region and will help with addressing unlicensed contracting concerns in the southern part of the state. The division hopes to complete an MOU with the university and PSI in the next month.
- The new electronic file protocol for EPR has been implemented to accommodate plans with individual sheets. Code text is now being entered into EPR from the ICC website. CID continues to give demonstrations statewide on the EPR submittals. To date demonstrations have been given to Las Cruces Homebuilders, NAIOP, Intel and Urenco.
- Since the last meeting, there has been significant progress at the Spaceport. The Hanger Facility (THF) has received Certificate of Occupancy. The SOC building (Support Operations) has received its CO. CID was also able to participate in a tour with NAIOP leadership, developing leaders and board members on the day the CO was issued.

- (2) New procedures have been established since the last meeting: EPR electronic file protocol implemented to accommodate plans with individual sheets and RCI testing and certification procedures.
- CID and Intel have entered into an MOU to clarify their annual permit: Clarifies language in the amended Annual Permit (R/M-industrial permits) to ensure accommodation of tool replacement and exchange and clarifies what Annual permit does not include.
- The Residential Certified Inspector (RCI) program has been a huge success. The following inspectors have passed their first round of multiple certification exams: Lois Blocker, Edward Sanchez, Doug Rapp, James Darnold, and Thomas Maese.
- LP Gas Bureau has prepared the documentation for the movie special effects and for the concerts required for the Standards also including the fees and affidavits.
- LP Inspectors monitored the Balloon Fiesta vendors and refueling stations throughout the event. The fueling station is world class and the LP Bureau plays an integral role in the event's success.
