Chairman Baker & Members of the Construction Industries Commission

Director's Update:

Good Morning! Thank you for the opportunity to report to you today the events of CID for the months of March and April, 2017.

1. CID "Partnered " with Jaynes Corporation, General Contractor, a Developer from New York, formerly from New Mexico, the Village Administration of Taos Ski Valley, and in particular, their CBO, Plan reviewer, and Building Inspector in the development and construction of the new \$70M, Phase I mixed use occupancy; The Blake Hotel, located in the middle of the Taos Ski Village. The project was extremely successful under some very difficult circumstances.

The American Institute of Architects, (AIA) Albuquerque Chapter ask us all to present this amazing project to their Membership at their March luncheon meeting. I was one of the presenters, and as guest, all Bureau Chiefs attended the presentation. It was a great opportunity for CID to show how we can play a vital role in the development of a difficult project under an extremely limited Construction Schedule.

2. CID now has approval to move forward with the required "Public Hearing" process in the upcoming months regarding the adoption of our next round of codes.

- The Electrical Bureau is ready to go to Public Hearing with the intent of adopting the 2017 NMEC/NEC Code. We are scheduled to go to Public Hearing May 31, 2017. CIC Chairman Randy Baker is scheduled to hold the Public Hearing at 9:00 AM in a 2nd floor Hearing Room of the Toney Anaya Building 2550 Cerrillos Road, Santa Fe, NM.

3. CID is also proposing that we move forward toward the 2018 Legislative Session with the goal of introducing a new Bill that includes changes, modification, and revisions to our current Construction Industries Licensing Act (CILA). We are wrapping up our in-house suggestions of revisions and will be going out to the industry for presentation and feedback.

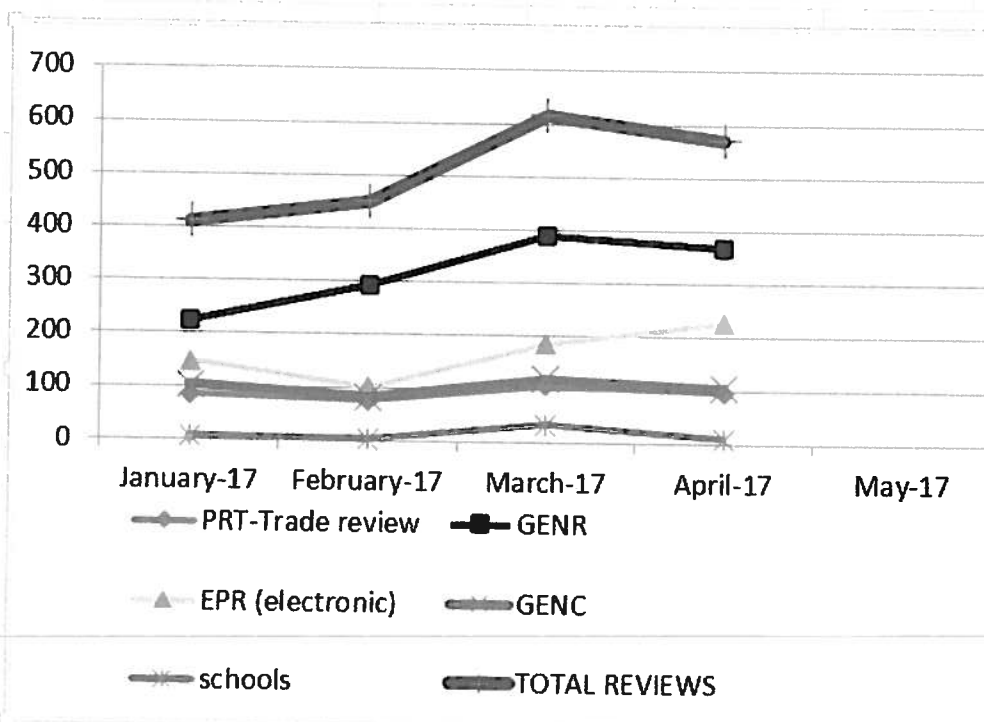

BUREAU UPDATES

GENERAL CONSTRUCTION BUREAU – March and April, 2017

Martin Romero - Bureau Chief

- UNM Hospital submitted a variance to the Construction Industries Division which was heard on April 12, 2017 by the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC). The appeal was requesting a variance from the code requirements of the 2009 IBC section 1008 Door, Gates and Turnstiles. Based on the information that was provided to the TAC the variance has been approved at this time based on the code requirements of the 2015 IBC.
- Immediate corrections are in the process of being completed on the Glorieta 2.0 for upcoming/current retreats. LP fuel has been released on several Buildings and the immediate corrections have been addressed.
- Meeting was held with the NMDOT Maintenance division (Rick Padilla and Andrew Gallegos), Outdoor advertising (Michael Otero and Robbie Quintana) and the Office of General Counsel (Ken Baca and General Construction Chief, Martin Romero. All thought it would be a good idea to meet with CID to discuss our overlapping concerns and “permit” functions. NMDOT has received several new Outdoor Advertising permit applications this year and they have decided to hold off on processing the new applications until we can coordinate between both agencies the permitting process moving forward.
- **Construction Industries Division Modular Audit.** There are 31 States, including New Mexico, that HUD has agreed to accept State approval of modular housing so that manufacturers do not have to obtain a separate Structural Engineering Bulletin (SEB). These States are called Category III Housing States. In Category III States,

housing units or building components that are subject to State regulations for design and construction receive a State label. All 31 states agreed that HUD personnel or its contractor may visit their state agency at least once a year to review their regulatory procedures, and monitoring of production line inspections at a factory producing modular or panelized housing units complying with an appropriate building code. On April 24, 2015 Seanan Ammar, PE, PMP with the Savan Group, HUD's selected contractor, conducted the required Audit and provided the following comments. **Martin. Thank you for your group taking the time to arrange and meet for our audit. New Mexico has a good modular program especially you're in plant inspections.**

Kudo's to Martin Romero, Mary James, and Loretta Vialpando for all their help and effort in preparing for this required audit. In our meeting with Mr. Ammar, we were able to quickly respond to his questions and concerns by referencing a notebook that had been put together for that purpose, thanks to this teams efforts!

- The topic of Tiny Homes, permitting and constructing continues to develop both nationally and locally. I was invited to make a presentation to the Mid-Region Council of Governments (MRCOG) on permitting Tiny Homes on Friday, April 28th. I, along with my Bureau Chiefs, gave the presentation and responded to a questions and answers session afterwards, it was well received.

Due to this Tiny Homes concept of dwelling, which is currently not addressed sufficiently in any of the existing codes nationally, IBC has created an Appendix V for the 2018 IRC Building code. CID has reviewed the proposed Appendix V, of the International residential code and have brought it forward to our General Construction Bureau Technical Advisory Council (TAC). The TAC, in turn set up a sub-committee to review and propose any necessary changes with the intent that we can move forward through the public hearing process and adopt Appendix V into our recently adopted IRC 2015 code. We feel that this new Appendix V more specifically addresses the concerns and issues surrounding the Tiny Home concept of dwellings.

- An example of the types of questions that we are getting daily regarding the Tiny Home movement for New Mexico is a Conference call meeting that we recently had with Amin Brodie, a licensed architect in China, to talk about shipping containers been shipped in to New Mexico from China. They are requesting approval to ship container homes built and inspected in China into the state and have CID approve the units permitted for use in Valencia County. Amin Brodie is finalizing building plans and has been told that they must conform to the 2015 IRC as well as the New Mexico Modular amendments.

MECHANICAL BUREAU – March and April, 2017

J.T. Baca – Bureau Chief

- The Mechanical Bureau along with other CID Trade Bureaus and Plans Staff met with UNM staff to discuss plans for renovating and expanding Johnson Center. CID continues to provide meetings to pre review project obstacles and issues that may arise during construction. These meetings continue to be successful in partnering with UNM facilities staff in addressing project issues prior to construction to make for smoother permitting and inspections of these projects.
- Bureau Chief J.T. Baca along with fellow Bureau Chiefs and Director McMurray met with Ms. Cleary, a resident of Rio Communities, NM regarding the modification of a manufactured home frame for a tiny home she was building for herself. The CID staff also had a discussion and information meeting to address a tiny home community she is proposing to develop in Rio Communities just west of the Los Lunas area in Valencia County. CID staff provided codes, and plans and permitting requirements to give her guidance on a proposed tiny home subdivision and a planned conversion of a mobile home park.
- Bureau Chief J.T. Baca and Chief Inspector James Darnold participated in a Backflow Meeting regarding Planet Fitness in Hobbs which took place with code officials from Hobbs, the facility management head from planet fitness and Safety Systems Inc. a fire protection contractor who specializes in backflow protection. The meeting was regarding backflow endorsement and water authority enforcement of local ordinances and CID requirements for licensing. CID Mechanical Bureau provided guidance to help resolve a misunderstanding for all parties involved.
- The Mechanical Bureau held its regularly scheduled M-TAC meeting on 4-13-17. The agenda included the following: Presentation of product by Phil Humphries of Viega-Mega Press for Fluids and Water use, Steve Crespin - Notification of Failed Plumbing Products and proposed legislation by Senator Bill Payne, J.T. Baca, TAC Review of the LP4 MOU between CID Mechanical Bureau and LP Gas Bureau and possible conflicts with municipal ordinances., 2015 Code Review assignments and update. Review and approval of CEU Courses/Instructors.
- Chief Inspector Tom Sanchez held the 10th and final scheduled “Code Outreach Training” on the 2012 Significant UPC/UMC Code Changes on April 20th and 21st in Santa Fe, NM at the RLD Rio Grande Room. The training was open to the public and at no cost to attendees. CEUs were provided. The trainings covered significant code changes and amendments, NMAC requirements and code essentials and also current inspection procedures. This was an ICC provider approved course.

ELECTRICAL BUREAU – March and April, 2017

Kelly Hunt – Bureau Chief

- Approval to go to public hearing on the 2017 NMEC/NEC was granted and the hearing is scheduled for 5-31-17 in SF.
- Anticipating the adoption of the 2017 NMEC/NEC we will be instituting 2017 NMEC/NEC code change training culminating in the much anticipated NFPA post adoption training to be held August 23rd of 2017 with NFPA SW Region Code Specialist Tim McClintock. All State Certified Electrical Inspectors will be welcomed to the training wherein they will receive 8 contact hours of ICC Preferred Provider training and a soft bound 2017 NEC at no charge.
- Our new ICC Preferred Provider status has proven very beneficial and timely with regard to supporting our inspectors with their required CEU's tied to their continued National Certification. We have provided room in our CID training for sister jurisdictions under the same CEU requirements to attend at no cost which fosters better communication relations along with closer code application between agencies.
- Electrical Chief Inspectors are keeping current with employee evaluations and continued mentoring and guidance.

LP GAS BUREAU – March and April, 2017

Clay Bailey – Bureau Chief

- Inspections continue for TV series and movies that include “End of Santa Fe Trail”, “Mission Control”, “Fast Color”, “Meow Music Video”, “Scalped” and “Get Shorty”.
- Special events for March included St. Patrick’s Day Balloon Rally, Ty Murray Professional Bull Riders Tour, UNM Kiva Club and Chocolate and Coffee Fest held at Expo NM.
- On March 2, 2017, Chief Inspector James Morrison attended the Gathering of Nations vendor meeting. The event moving to a new location will add challenges as everyone gets used to a new layout at Expo NM.
- On March 3 and 21, 2017, inspections were performed in conjunction with the Department of Health regarding cannabis extractions.
