Chairman Baker & Members of the Construction Industries Commission

Director's Update:

Good Morning! Thank you for the opportunity to report to you today the events of CID for the months of January and February, 2016.

As you know, the 2016 Legislative Session ended on February 18th. The majority of the Session dealt with budget issues. To my knowledge, there was no new legislation introduced and passed that effected CID.

I'm sure you all are aware of the constraints regarding the state budget, primarily due to the fact that oil and gas prices have dropped significantly. CID is in good shape for the remainder of FY2016, and we are comfortable with the approved FY2017 CID budget. As always I will continue to work with my Financial Manager, Mr. Rick Martinez daily to monitor CID's budget to ensure that we stay within our approved budget.

The good news is that the Administration understands the importance of our inspectors and has established them as essential and critical positions. Therefore, working within our vacancy rate, we continue to hire new inspectors in all bureaus. We are extremely grateful for the understanding from the administration, that these inspection positions are essential to the economic development and continued growth of New Mexico's construction industry.

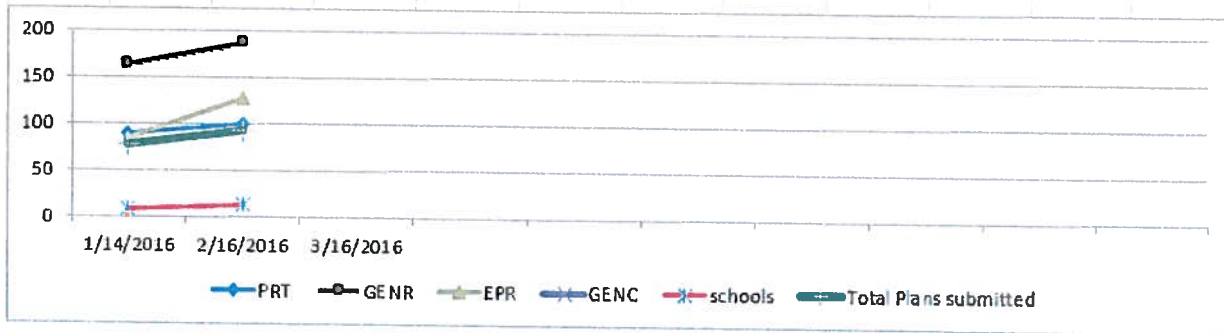

BUREAU UPDATES

GENERAL CONSTRUCTION BUREAU – January and February, 2016

Martin Romero - Bureau Chief

- Meeting with UNM School of Engineering Wet Labs project to review the permitting, prior to submitting for a permit in February. It was agreed that a meeting with the State Fire Marshal's office would be beneficial to the project. This meeting would need to include John Ludi of the State Fire Marshal's office, CID staff including Bennet Lopez, Richard Lucero and Tamara Kuykendall, UNM, Bridgers and Paxton and McClain + Yu. The major items for discussion for this meeting are anticipated to be: (A.) Review of fire sprinkler system. (B.) UNM Administrative measures addressing lab safety practices.
- Janet Smith with the City of Portales has been approved for Building Inspector. Janet Smith holds a GB98 and has a current license with the State of NM.
- CID has agreed to present at the May 4, 2016 conference in the afternoon for the municipal league of counties. The conference will be on "Tiny Homes" we are seeing more of these homes which are been manufactured with Park Homes. The conference will be held in Las Cruces at the Hotel Encanto de Las Cruces.

MECHANICAL BUREAU – January and February, 2016

J.T. Baca – Bureau Chief

- Mechanical Bureau Chief Baca, along with other CID Bureau Chiefs, plans staff and Director McMurray met with URENCO USA senior staff regarding the transition of the facility from a construction project to facilities maintenance and retooling project. The project has been under continued construction and expansion since 2008 and has now close to completion. CID Staff partnered with UUSA on permitting and inspections, from the beginning, making the transition seamless and is committed to working well with the facility in the future.
- Mechanical Bureau staff met with UNM design staff regarding UNM School of Engineering Wet Labs project to review the overall project status and the permitting, prior to submitting for a permit in February. The pre-con meeting was to collectively share concerns and ideas to avoid delays in construction.

- Mechanical Bureau Chief JT. Baca attended the General Construction TAC code change meeting to help review NMAC code change documents affecting swimming pool construction and to provide comment regarding the 2015 IRC Code adoption after comparison to the UPC Code requirements for pools as per the 2012 code Pool and Spa Code. Chief Baca participated in the review and provided some comments.

ELECTRICAL BUREAU – January and February, 2016

Kelly Hunt – Bureau Chief

- We recently hired an electrical inspector in the Carlsbad area and for the SE Permian Basin Oil Patch area. Mr. Jason Moyers started on 2-15-16 and hit the ground running with 68 inspections conducted his first week in the field. Drilling contracts continue to keep a brisk pace in the SE even though the price of oil has dropped.
- We are in the process of filling an additional electrical inspector position for the Ruidoso area. We are anticipating having this individual hired by the end of March.
- Hobbs has successfully hired in a new electrical inspector, Mr. Bill Davis. We will provide assistance with training and ride-along time to help him adjust into his new position and assure uniformity with State codes and regulations.
- Statewide Oil & Gas inspections keep a steady pace even though news of industry wide cutbacks continue to grow.
- I am scheduling a one day IAEI training in Albuquerque We will invite RLD/CID staff to include, Superintendent, Director and Bureau Chiefs for CEU credits for all who wish to attend. We also invite political subdivision electrical inspectors who wish to pay their own way to this training as well.

- Special event inspections included the Super Nationals Car Show and the KOB Health Fair. Inspections for TV series “Preacher” and “The Night Shift” were also performed.
- Bureau Chief Bailey along with LP Gas Bureau employees Brenda Sakelaris, James Morrison and Russ Hunter attended an active shooter class held in Santa Fe.
- During the Legislative Session, CID Director McMurray and Bureau Chief Bailey met with NM Gas Association President Billy Romero and their lobbyist Scott Scanland at the capitol building to discuss issues of timeliness regarding LP Gas delivery in remote areas of the state due to the winter storms.
- Bureau Chief Bailey worked an incident in Santa Rosa. The incident involved a propane tank that was being cut open.
