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### Chairman Baker & Members of the Construction Industries Commission

#### Director's Update:

Good Morning! Thank you for the opportunity to report to you today the events of CID for the months of September and October, 2015.

- We went live with Accela, our new software for permitting and scheduling inspections on Tuesday October 13<sup>th</sup>. There were some issues, and we continue to experience some issues today, especially in regards to the issuance of permits. Primary reasons for issues are in regards to the verification of addresses, and in the listing of the Contractors' classifications ensuring that the issued permit is for the "scope of work" that the classification allows. These are internal/software issues that we are trying to get corrected. In the meantime, we are doing work a-rounds to verify addresses and classification status.

We were ready to go live in that we had IT department personnel located at each of our three offices, we conducted extensive training with our "frontline personnel" and had staffed the front counters in each office to handle the workload, as well as the call-ins. Even so, several people expressed their disfavor with us in not letting them know that we were going live on that date, as it was a surprise to them.

We posted it several weeks ahead of time on our web site, posted it in each of our offices for walk-ins to see, but for many who never visit our website it did come as a surprise. We also worked with the Manufactured Housing Industry, as they hosted a WEBINAR with screen shots and audio describing the process. This was also posted on our web site for both CID & MHD customers to access and view. I'm not sure how we could have done it differently, but we learned that you really can't anticipate the issues until you do go live, and see what the issues are when filling out the required permitting application forms.

We also have listed on our web site an Accela help desk email address that is monitored all day with IT personnel ready to guide customers through the process. All in all, we continue to play catch up regarding the paper work, but have not delayed permitting and construction inspection scheduling due to the staffs work a-rounds. If anyone has additional concerns or comments, or is approached by someone who has concerns, please do not hesitate to contact me with their concerns and we will help in their understanding the process.

- We also have a new web site. It is graphically more interesting. We have posted photos of our leadership personnel, on site with attached Bio's and contact numbers. We have update the information throughout the site, and are posting all upcoming events as required on the web as we have always done. We continue to make changes to the web pages adding information that keeps our customers better informed regarding forms and processes for both CID and MHD.
- We recently held a Division wide training and BBQ event which was very successful. We concentrated on Accela training primarily in regards to the field inspectors, and then had several individual awards presented for "going beyond employee expectations with customers and various projects, as well as some "roasts" for those that also exceeded expectations.

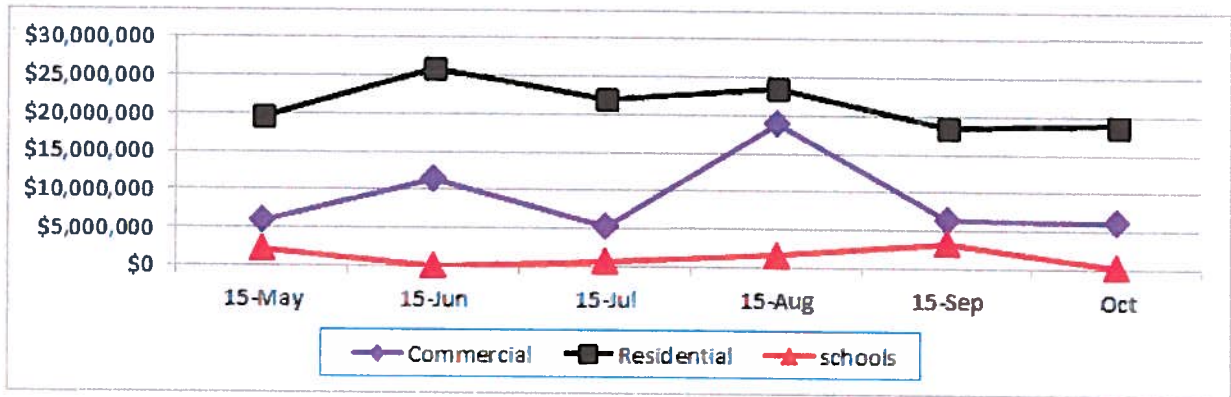
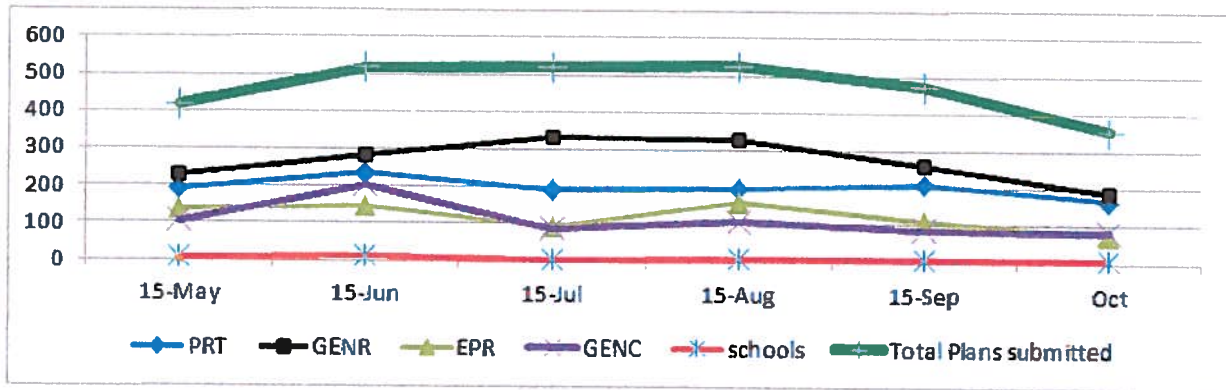

## **BUREAU UPDATES**

### **GENERAL CONSTRUCTION BUREAU – September and October, 2015**

#### **Martin Romero - Bureau Chief**

- The General Construction Bureau has filled the position in Northern New Mexico, for Raton Red River, Angel fire, Clayton, and Mora County. Mauro Rosales has been hired as a multiple inspector for Plumbing, and mechanical.
- The CBO for Doña Ana County (DAC) has retired. Therefore DAC and the city of Las Cruces will be entering in to a MOU agreement.
- The Town of Taos was unable to enter in to a MOU agreement with any county, municipality, or other political subdivision within the one hundred miles requirement as required by rule. Furthermore, there current inspector was unable to pass the National Certifications as required per rule NMAC 14.6.5.8 B. Certification. As a result, all plan-reviews, and inspections are being performed by CID.
- A meeting was held In Albuquerque with the Interstate Industrialized Buildings Commission (IIBC) to discuss the feasibility of entering in to a Reciprocal Agreement for in-plant inspections on Modular structures.
- The General Construction Bureau continues to work with Colorado code consulting to providing training on the 2015 IBC & IRC significant changes, when the time arises.

## MECHANICAL BUREAU – September and October, 2015

### J.T. Baca – Bureau Chief

- Bureau Chief J.T. Baca along with Bureau Chief Martin Romero and Director Pat McMurray met with officials from the State Fair and the State Fire Marshal's office amid concerns that Fire and Construction requirements regarding temporary events and structures. The CID staff was also able to initiate a plan to help future temporary events statewide by committing to participation in a working group this coming year. The working group hopes to draft a temporary events procedure applicable to all state temporary events. This meeting and following cursory walk through inspections resulted in a normal start and operation of the State Fair.
- Bureau Chief J.T. Baca, Chief Inspector Tamara Kuykendall and Inspector James Otero conducted mechanical and plumbing walkthrough inspections at the State Fair. The inspections were to detect and address any situation that might affect life safety and health. The inspections were successful and incidents addressed were minimal.
- The Mechanical Bureau held its regular TAC meeting on September 15<sup>th</sup>. Some of the agenda items included an update on Senate Bill Memorial 27 (Fire Dampers). Product approval on a new poly based pipe for refrigeration line sets, variance request review and advisory, and CEU course approval review.
- Bureau Chief Baca along with fellow BCs and Director attended a meeting with UNM facilities senior staff to begin to develop a partnership regarding upcoming construction projects and to review progress of ongoing work. The partnership will aim to improve communication, avoid delays in construction and inspections and better address issues as they arise prior to and during construction. The meeting was successful in improving the partnership.
- Bureau Chief J.T. Baca attended the IAPMO 86<sup>th</sup> Annual Education and Business Conference. Bureau Chief Baca who serves on two IAPMO committees was there to present training as a member of the Plumbing Workshop Committee. Throughout the year the committee develops scenario based code training drawings and a few are selected to be published in the award winning quarterly internationally distributed IAPMO magazine. Bureau Chief Baca had the honor of having one of his drawings selected for publication and for use in the training. The workshop training session is the most popular training venue at the annual education conference and is generally attended by over 100 individuals including, architects, engineers, code officials, contractors, and others. CEUS are provided for the training sessions.

- Chief Inspector Tamara Kuykendall represented J.T. Baca at the CNM Plumbing Advisory Board meeting for the 2016 -2017 academic year. The meeting allowed board members to provide feedback regarding career enrichment day training CNM provides for NM high schools. Chief Kuykendall took the opportunity to inform the members that the enforcement of the 2012 edition of the Uniform Codes would begin November 1<sup>st</sup> after a six month grace period from May 1<sup>st</sup>. 2015. The Instructors have anticipated and adjusted the curriculum to begin using the newly adopted codes in the HVAC and Plumbing classes.

## **ELECTRICAL BUREAU – September and October, 2015**

### **Kelly Hunt – Bureau Chief**

- EXPO NM was inspected in similar fashion as preceding years. Violations were noted and corrected, the majority of the violations had to do with cord violations by the vendors. The new Midway vendor Reithoffer was present and demonstrated cooperation in addressing and correcting violations on equipment, and in regards to temporary premises wiring supplying rides. We cooperated and shared information with Paulina Robinson's Carnival Industry Inspectors; Lundy and Associates, who were charged with inspecting the rides themselves for insurance certificate purposes. Verifying all ride serial numbers for Ms. Robinson, as in years past, was also accomplished.
- The Electrical Bureau reviewed the application status for a Ruidoso electrical inspector candidate. The review of the submitted information resulted in an approval to take the state electrical exam which was sent to PSI. We await the results of that test. If successful and hired by Ruidoso, it will take a lot of pressure off of Mark Nelson. Our CID Electrical inspector, who has been covering Ruidoso for over a year now.
- Chavez County has voiced an interest in getting one of their staff approved as a state electrical inspector and the bureau was able to approve the candidate to take the inspectors exam. If he is successful this too will take a great load off of the electrical bureaus obligations for oil & gas inspections in Chavez county and possibly Artesia if they extend an MOU in that regard. The electrical bureau has been covering Artesia for over six months now.



## **LP GAS BUREAU – September and October, 2015**

### **Clay Bailey – Bureau Chief**

- Inspections for TV series and movies included “Tagged”, “Better Call Saul”, “Graves” and “The Space Between Us” were performed.
- Special event inspections included the Zozobra, Hatch Chili Festival, Labor Day Arts and Craft Show, Bernalillo Beer Fest, Santa Fe Fiesta, New Mexico State Fair and the Eastern New Mexico State Fair, Southern New Mexico State Fair, Albuquerque Art Festival, the Disk-it Challenge and the International Balloon Fiesta. The bulk of the bureau’s special event season wrapped up with the end of the Balloon Fiesta
- The LP Gas held their TAC meeting on September 1, 2015.
- The LP Gas Bureau has worked over 60 special events this season throughout the state, had over 800 inspections at these events with approximately 950 code corrections addressed.
- On October 26 thru 30, 2015, Bureau Chief Bailey attended CNG/LNG training in Nashville, Tennessee. Purpose was to become familiar with the construction requirements and dispensing requirements regarding compressed natural gas (CNG).
