## SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the State of New Mexico Board of Social Work Examiners (hereafter the "Board") has issued a Notice of Contemplated Action (hereafter "NCA") in this matter to Respondent, Robert Moslow; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to resolve this matter without the time and expense of a formal hearing.

## IT IS AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

- The Board has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Social Work Practice Act
  ("Act"), NMSA 1978, §§ 61-31-1 et seq., and the Rules of the Board ("Rules"),
  16.63.1 NMAC et seq. and thereby has the power to act allowed by, and in
  accordance with, the Uniform Licensing Act.
- The Respondent previously held a license under the Social Work Practice Act, Section 61-31-1 et seq, NMSA 1978, and is subject to the jurisdiction of the Board. Respondent's license is currently revoked due to expiration pursuant with NMSA 1978 §61-31-14.
- This Settlement Agreement ("Agreement") is subject to the approval of the Board.
   If the Board rejects this Agreement, this matter will be heard at a later time, date,

- psychologist or similarly accredited professional stating that he is capable both physically and mentally to practice.
- 9. Respondent further acknowledges that any violation(s) by Respondent of this Settlement Agreement will immediately result in the filing of an Order to Show Cause as to why the Board should not find the Respondent in violation of the Agreement and impose lawful sanctions including, but not limited to, the imposition of the remainder of the civil penalty, additional fines or penalties and/or take any other disciplinary action set forth in the Uniform Licensing Act.
- 10. This Agreement is a settlement of Board case number SW 14-03-07, and only the specific allegations contained therein. The board reserves the right to initiate proceedings against Respondent for any other violations of the Social Work Practice Act or the Rules and Regulations of the Board adopted pursuant to that Act.
- 11. The NCA and this Agreement are public records within the meaning of the Inspection of Public Records Act, NMSA 1978, § 14-2-6(E). Other data, communications, and information acquired by the Board relating to this matter shall be public as provided by the Social Work Practice Act and promulgated Board regulations.
- 12. Respondent has read this Agreement and fully understands each provision.
  Respondent's signature below acknowledges that he knowingly, intelligently, and freely agrees with the terms and conditions of the Agreement.
- 13. The Respondent is represented by Counsel Phillip W. Cheves and Quiana Salazar-King of the law firm Butt Thornton & Baehr PC.

- and place to be set by the Board; any statements made by any party herein in negotiation or furtherance of the Agreement may not be used at a hearing before the Board unless otherwise admissible into evidence through a source independent of the settlement negotiations.
- 4. In order for the Board to have adequate time to consider this Agreement,
  Respondent waives the right to have this matter heard and decided within the time
  frame set by the Uniform Licensing Act, NMSA 1978, §§ 61-1-1 through -31.
- 5. In order to resolve this matter, the Respondent does not contest the Board's assertion of the allegations contained in the NCA including allegations of violating NMAC 16.63.16.8(J)(I) and NMSA 61-31-17. Respondent acknowledges that he is subject to disciplinary action pursuant to NMSA 1978, § 61-31-17 and does not contest that he is subject to discipline for the actions described in the NCA.
- 6. Respondent acknowledges that his license has been revoked by statutory default for failing to renew his license once it had expired. As part of this Settlement Agreement, Respondent does not contest that his license will now be considered revoked due to disciplinary action.
- Respondent acknowledges that he has no intention to seek to practice social work
  again, and currently receives Social Security Disability based on his medical
  condition.
- 8. Should Respondent's intentions change and he plans to to reapply for a social work license, Respondent agrees that he shall obtain a letter from a geriatric
