

New Mexico Real Estate License Recognition Agreements

New Mexico has license recognition agreements with <u>Louisiana</u>, <u>Massachusetts</u>, and <u>Georgia</u>. Those who qualify are eligible for licensure in New Mexico without having to take the licensure examination or complete pre-licensing educational requirements. Applicants by recognition are required to be current (not expired) with their recognized state's licensure requirements and status can be either active or inactive.

Applicants wishing to apply for a New Mexico real estate license under the license recognition program can submit an application with NMPlus:

Please provide the following with your application:

- A certified license history from <u>all</u> jurisdictions in which the applicant is currently or has been previously licensed.
- Current errors and omissions (E&O) insurance coverage.
- Fingerprinting registration receipt (fingerprinting instruction are available on the commission website)

By virtue of applying for a New Mexico real estate license under the license recognition program, the applicant is attesting that they have read and agree to comply with the New Mexico Real Estate License Law and the Real Estate Commission Rules, and further agree to cooperate with any investigation initiated against the applicant by the New Mexico Real Estate Commission.
